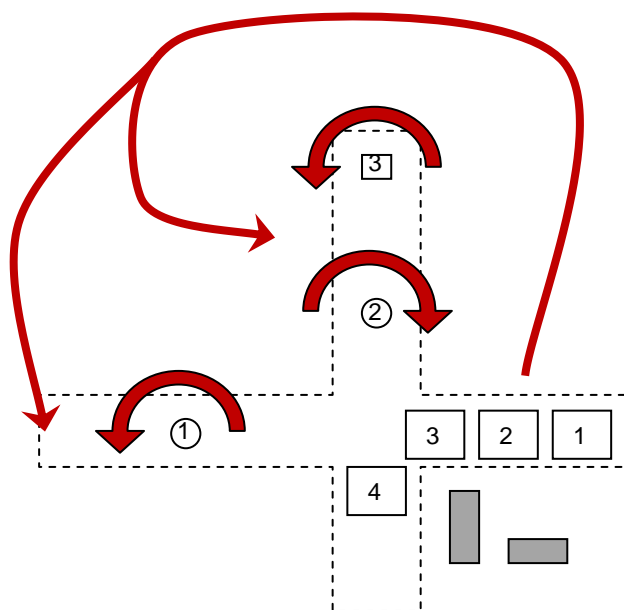

This is an example of a task information sheet.

In this case it is for Task 99, which is a task in the form of Task A.

Task information sheets will be released onto the intranet a reasonable time before the briefing. The exact time will be announced in the briefing announcement which will have already been published on the intranet and on the official notice board.

In this case this task information sheet is released 2 hours before the briefing which should give everybody plenty of time to read and understand it, and print it if necessary.

The time may be increased in the case of more complex tasks.

In this case it's pretty simple. Pilots do a precision take off from their assigned deck, fly outside the airfield gaining height and join the circular circuits around their assigned landing target **quite high**. When their start number is displayed they head towards the centre of the circuit, cut their engine and make their descent to land.

As this task divides PF1 & PF2 into two halves, the giant numbers at target 1 will display 1,3,5,7,9 Etc. and 2,4,6,8,10 Etc at target 2.

The start order list in this example is only class PF1, but of course all classes will be shown.

Note that start order lists will show pilots who we know to be non-starters, though of course this can't possibly be definitive. They are the pilots shown with a dark background in the list. Pilots immediately after them should pay particular attention to this.
